COURSE DESCRIPTION AND TARGET AUDIENCE

Students enrolled in MUSC213.001 (Marching/Athletic Band) learn and perform a variety of repertoire and movements intended for entertainment at athletic events. Carolina students who play a wind, brass or percussion instrument, or who participate in pageantry activities, and are interested in having this sort of experience are welcome to enroll in the course.

COURSE GOALS

Through the study and performance of the selected music and movement, the course hopes to develop musicianship and movement skills, an appreciation of the historical and cultural significance of the music and movements being performed, and to present entertaining performances at athletic events.

COMPETENCIES TO BE DEVELOPED

Students will be challenged to develop better playing, listening, movement, and expressive skills.

ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Attendance is required at all class meetings and performances. If it becomes necessary to miss class or a performance, an absence request form must be completed and submitted online at least 24 hours in advance of the class meeting and 2 weeks in advance of a performance. Realize this is a REQUEST to be absent and you will receive a note back from the instructor letting you know if the absence is excused or unexcused and whether it needs to be made-up. In cases of illness or emergency, which prevents the required advance notice, contact the Band Office by telephone (919-962-5695) at least one hour prior to the beginning of the class meeting/performance that will be missed. In the hour prior to a class meeting/performance, contact Mr. Fuchs at 919-215-3133.

Absences will not be excused for group project meetings or other activities that can, and should, be scheduled around class time. Likewise, exams and activities for other classes will not be excused without a note from the Professor asking that you be excused from class. Absences to return home for the weekend or to attend high school activities will not typically be excused. Absences for family weddings, anniversary celebrations, funerals

and other significant events will typically be excused, assuming enough advance notice is given. All excused absences can be made-up by attending other events (see info under grading).

It is the student's responsibility to be check-in using the UDB app prior to the beginning of each class meeting/performance or whenever they arrive if the class/performance has begun.

Never assume a class meeting/performance is cancelled because of inclement weather. Weather-related announcements will be distributed via email when necessary. It is the student's responsibility to be subscribed to the listsery to receive these messages.

UNIVERSITY ATTENDANCE POLICY

University Policy: No right or privilege exists that permits a student to be absent from any class meetings, except for these University Approved Absences:

- 1. Authorized University activities
- 2. Disability/religious observance/pregnancy, as required by law and approved by <u>Accessibility Resources</u> and Service and/or the Equal Opportunity and Compliance Office (EOC)
- 3. Significant health condition and/or personal/family emergency as approved by the Office of the Dean of Students, Gender Violence Service Coordinators, and/or the Equal Opportunity and Compliance Office (EOC).

Instructors may work with students to meet attendance needs that do not fall within University approved absences. For situations when an absence is not University approved (e.g., a job interview or club activity), instructors determine their own approach to missed classes and make-up assessments and assignments.

MASKS

Students are welcomed to be masked during class meetings and performances. Unless instructed by the University, there will be no precautions such as masks and/or bell covers required during class or performances.

GRADING

The semester grade is based on preparation, participation, performance, attendance, and cooperation. Students will receive 10 points for each class session, pep band performance, and basketball band performance assigned to them. At the end of the semester, the points earned with be divided by the required points and this will determine the semester grade. In all cases, averages will be rounded up according to standard practice.

All absences can (and should) be made up (1 make up event per absence). Scheduled pep band performances and volunteer events can be used as make-up events. Students must notify the band office of the event(s) they will use as make-up events in advance of the event so accurate records can be kept.

There will be approximately 260 points available for the semester: 100 for class meetings, 60 for pep band events, and 100 for men's basketball games. The points available will change as necessary during the semester (i.e., if a class is cancelled those points will not be available).

Students are expected to have all appropriate materials and equipment/supplies with them at every class meeting/performance. Equipment should be in good working order and appropriate clothing should be worn. Students are expected to strive to improve as performers and always perform to the best of their ability.

Students must follow all announced uniform guidelines and are not excused until dismissed by one of the directors or a designated staff member. When in the stands at performances, only uniformed members of the band and band staff are allowed in the designated band areas.

PEP BAND POLICIES

Students who play instruments will be divided into 8 pep bands (PB), which will perform at various sporting events throughout the year. Students are welcome to volunteer to play at any event they are not required to play, however, participating as a volunteer does not replace an assigned event.

Students who cannot attend an assigned pep band performance are responsible to find someone with whom they can "swap" events. Students planning to "swap" an event must complete and submit the online swap form or email Dr. Cooper (cooperec@email.unc.edu) at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled event. Students who are unable to find someone to "swap" an event with should see Dr. Cooper for assistance finding a replacement and rescheduling one of their required events.

Students are expected to be ready to play 45 minutes before the published game time. It is the student's responsibility to be check-in using the UDB app prior to the beginning of each event or whenever they arrive if the event has begun.

Students are expected to have their instrument, mouthpiece, lyre, and all music at every event and are expected to support the UNC athletic team with enthusiasm by cheering when appropriate. The uniform for all pep band events other than women's basketball is the golf shirt with appropriate black shorts/pants and shoes. The uniform for all women's basketball games is the basketball band shirt with appropriate black shorts/pants and shoes. The only headgear members are allowed to wear in the stands at athletic events is the official Marching Tar Heels baseball cap.

MEN'S BASKETBALL BAND

Students are encouraged to participate in the men's basketball band (MBB). This band is formed towards the end of the fall semester and continues into the spring semester. Call time for all men's basketball games is 45 minutes prior to scheduled tip-off. Students are expected to have their instrument, mouthpiece, lyre, and all music at every event and are expected to support the UNC athletic team with enthusiasm by cheering when appropriate. Students who cannot attend an assigned basketball band event do not need to find a sub for the game.

The uniform for all basketball band events is the basketball band shirt with appropriate black shorts/pants and shoes. The only headgear members are allowed to wear in the stands at athletic events is the official Marching Tar Heels baseball cap.

VOLUNTEER PEP BAND OPPORTUNITIES

At various times during the semester, volunteer pep bands will be assembled to perform. All students are eligible to volunteer for these performance opportunities and these performances can be used as a make-up event for missed class meetings and performances. These events cannot be used to replace assigned events.

In most cases, the size of the volunteer pep band is dictated by NCAA rules or bus capacity. The goal is always to build the best possible band to represent the University and the UNC Bands, and the primary criteria used in selecting students is quality of performance. Beyond that, seniority, attendance at class meetings and performances, and other contributions to the UNC Band program will be considered. Every student will be considered individually and fairly and all decisions regarding selection for travel are at the discretion of the Directors. As much as possible, opportunities will be distributed equally among students.

SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

Students using school-owned equipment will be held responsible and charged for loss, damage because of carelessness, or if they fail to return the equipment by the designated time. Students are required to provide their own mouthpiece for musical instruments and all equipment should be kept clean and in good working order.

INSTRUMENT REPAIR

Music and Arts will visit campus once a week (or as needed) to repair instruments that belong to the UNC Bands or individual students. The location of the repair van will be announced in advance of each visit. School-owned instruments will be fixed free of charge, assuming the damage is from normal wear and tear. Repairs to individually owned instruments must be paid for by the owner using a credit/debit card at the time of the repair. In all cases, an estimate will be provided before any work is done on the instrument.

SUBSCRIBE TO MARCHING TAR HEELS LISTSERV

All students will be subscribed to our listserv using their UNC onyen. This will be used to distribute information regarding the class and will be the primary means of communication outside of class meetings.
